- I want to be very clear: this course would've been impossible without Julian Gerez. Someone who has the skill to take complex topics and make them digestible to undergrad, non-math, 'scared by statistics' students deserves an award. The very first week of class, we were given a reading, 95% of which I did not understand. Attending the main course did nothing to sway my nerves, with a lot of it going over my head. However, when I stepped into our discussion section, Julian explained everything we needed to know in a 30 page reading in under 30 minutes. I and the entire class understood everything he said. He comes prepared for section, speaks slowly and clearly, and stops for questions every chance he gets. Julian is patient, eager to teach, and a great teacher. I am a student who tends to be very shy speaking up in class, but he always encouraged us to reach out by any means we felt comfortable doing. My means was email, and every time I emailed he responded within 15 minutes and was always happy to help. His demeanor in class is light hearted, fun, and engaging and he always completed everything we needed to do within our short 50 minute window. As someone who also teaches kids younger than her, it is very rare that I stand truly impressed by someone else's ability to teach and from day 1 Julian impressed me. I will genuinely miss having a discussion section taught by such an amazing TA.
- He's not a good TA- he's a good professor. I wish he would teach the class, he's great at explaining.
- Julian is possibly one of the main reasons I enjoyed this class. Despite the disorganized nature of a new class, Julian did his best to provide clarification when he had the information. Beyond just logistics, Julian is fantastic at explaining complex material in a simple way which students can understand. I am not particularly good at stats but found that when Julian explained the material, I actually seemed to do well. His grading is fair, and even though there were sections I did not score well on, Julian justified his grading which makes it entirely palatable. Overall, Julian was amazing; 10/10 would recommend and take his class if he taught one.
